

**Needs-based** state university funding instead of dependence on third-party funding

The consequences of a focus on third-party funding and excellence: competition instead of cooperation, a focus on trendy topics, what cannot be sold is supposedly worth nothing. For vears, however, we have been fighting for needs-based basic

funding, most recently with some success. With the current military "turnaround" the next round of the Excellence Initiative, this is in jeopardy - all the more reason for us to stand up for it!



### Study reform & amendment of the University Law

Student numbers are falling because the social situation of students is deteriorating, the mental health situation is dramatic and higher education is less and less appropriate to the growing crises. Instead of tackling these problems, the state is replacing the missing students with students in further education, who pay up to €60,000 and whose study regulations are to be designed according to the wishes of their emplovers.

In contrast, we have been fighting for years
